Objectives of the Activity:

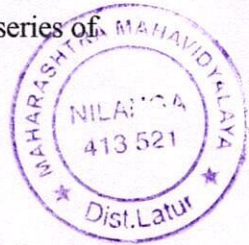
- To tell the story of Santiago, an aging fisherman, and his journey to catch a giant marlin.

Brief Report:

This inspiring story is beautifully picturize in an animated format by the director Aleksandr Petrov. The film was release d in 1999. The duration of the film is 20 minutes and it was awarded academy award for best animated short film in 2000. The short film "The Old Man and the Sea" is based on a novel by American author Ernest Hemingway, published in 1952. The story revolves around Santiago, an aging fisherman who catches an enormous marlin fish. For 84 days, Santiago, an aging Cuban fisherman, has returned from sea empty-handed. On the 85th day, he goes far out into the Gulf Stream, where he encounters a marlin. The marlin pulls the boat for several days, and Santiago endures constant pain from the fishing line. Eventually, he kills the marlin and lashes it to the side of his boat. As he sails back to the shore, the marlin's blood attracts sharks. Santiago fights them off, but they eat the marlin's meat, leaving only the skeleton. The old man returns to the shore, exhausted and wounded, with only the skeleton tied to his boat.

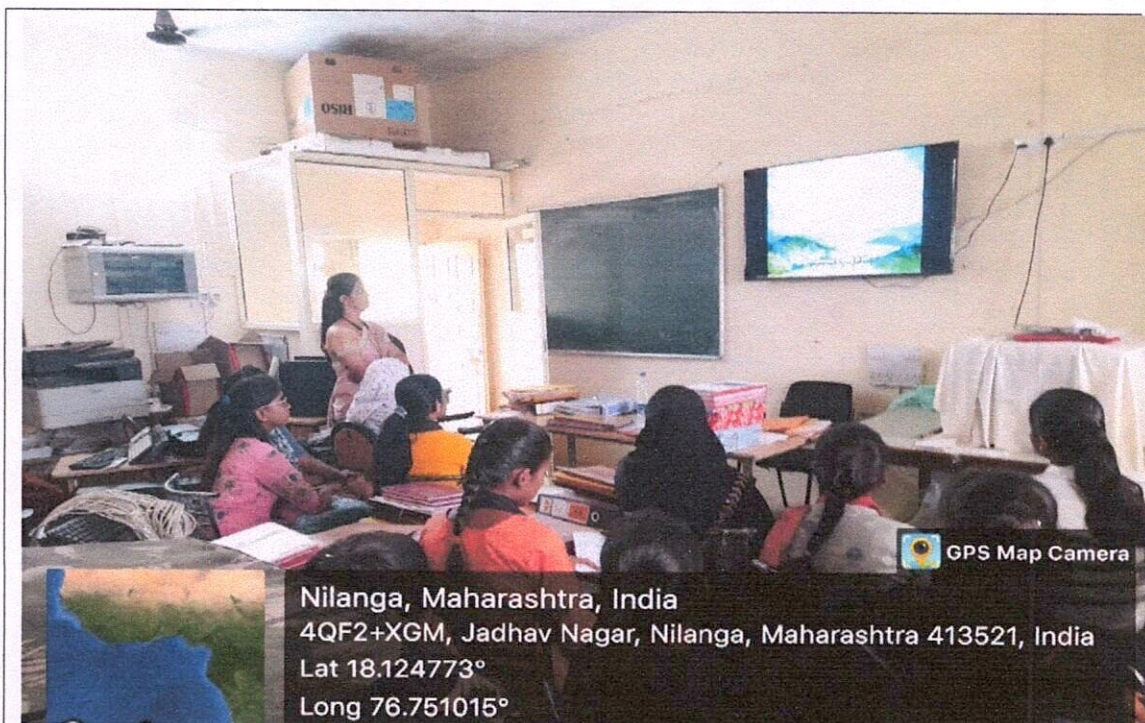
A crowd of fishermen gather around the skeletal carcass of the fish, and Manolin, the young boy who cares for the old man, is moved to tears when he finds Santiago safe in his bed. The old man returns to sleep, dreaming of lions at play on the beaches of Africa. The story has inspired millions

and its writer Ernest Hemingway was awarded with Nobel prize for literature. The story has given hope to the people in the most hopeless situations. It continues to motivate the people for going through hot chips to achieve that dreams and to keep persistently trying to bring their dreams into reality. Ms.Manisha Ghogre conducted a discussion on the short film. The students expressed their opinions and observations on the film. The students opined that the animation's quality was like painting. It was such that was never seen before. The entire feeling was of watching a long series of expressive paintings.



Outcomes of the Activity

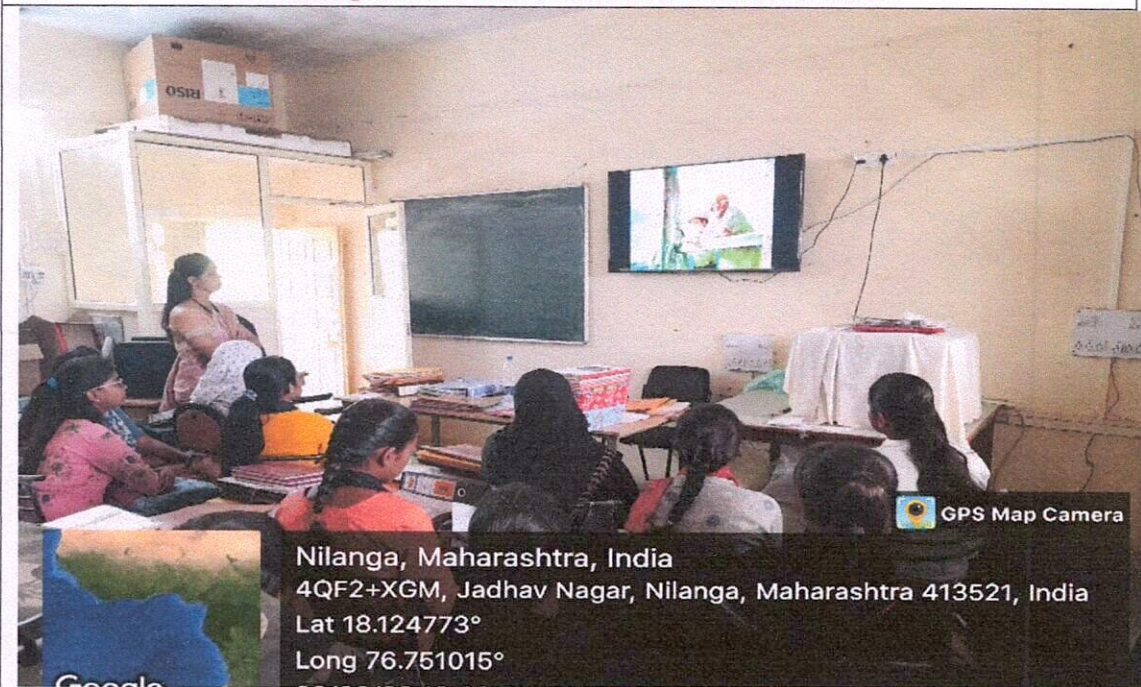
1. The difference between the real actors and the animated characters was perceived by the students.
